

Staying with children at the Lynx Camp

Dear parents, dear children, hearty welcome to the Lynx Camp Y



Unfortunately, in the past it has often happened that the harmony in the Lynx Camp e.g. is out of balance due to children left alone / unsupervised. Therefore, as a precaution, I would like to explain the rules from the camp order in a little more detail:

- ① I do not offer childcare. The parents are therefore responsible for the sole supervision over the entire period of the stay. Children must always be accompanied within the camp. If the worst comes to the worst, violations of the Camp Regulations must be prevented directly by the parents selves.
- ② The Lynx Camp is a place to drop out and relax. It is therefore inappropriate for the children to run through the camp, romp, shout and disturb other guests who are looking for relaxation. This applies throughout the camp and also during the day. A fellow camper might just want to read a book or take a nap. So being able to do what he came here specifically to do: relax, rest, recover, etc.. According to our special concept, we are definitely not designed for romping children. Also aggression (hitting, annoying, yelling, threatening, spitting, chasing, throwing stones or similar, threatening with sticks, shooting with slingshots or arrows, carrying/using knives/jackknives, bullying, excluding, etc.) towards other children are absolutely not tolerated here.
- ③ All outdoor games including soccer are not permitted in the camp. The small soccer field next to the big soccer field can be used for this. The large football field may be used for football outside of football club training and official football games, in the time window from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. It is forbidden to shoot the ball against the fence of the soccer field, as the loud banging is a disturbance of the peace. A noise protection solution is already being planned by the municipality.
- ④ In the sanitary facilities, children must be accompanied at all times. This means follow-up checks and, if necessary, clearing up afterwards. It is not the task of me or other guests to do this for the parents of the children. Our sanitary facilities are known for being neat and tidy at all times, thanks to our prudent guests who appreciate this and participate.
- ⑤ I have children by myself and I know that it is quite possible to teach children to be considerate of other people. This is a place that reflects exactly that. A good example, so to speak, to experience first-hand what a beautiful atmosphere is created when all people, including the very young, naturally show consideration for one another.
- ⑥ For us, nature is an asset worth protecting. Hitting trees with branches, tearing apart our Benje hedges / stacks of branches along the way and between the pitches, which are home to many insects and animals, trampling on small trees, etc. are acts that harm our nature and will not be tolerated. Children will find specific information about wild animals (e.g. the lynx), can observe animals, study plants, observe the course of the sun and moon, look at the breathtaking starry sky over the camp at night, etc.
- ⑦ Tip: During the day there are many things in the region that you can use to take the children, e.g. B. when hiking, in the swimming pool, when tobogganing/skiing, in the Black Forest Zoo, etc. can work out. In the evening, there is a night hike on the forest paths. They should then be in the camp accordingly compensated. And if the children are still not tired, there are many games to borrow in the sanitary facilities, books / magazines and a drawing table. Everything has to be returned / left behind in an orderly manner.
- ⑧ The camp concept, which is already known at the time of booking, is really lived here. We want to create a balance in a society that lives "ever faster - louder - higher", in which the children are often looked after by others and the mental connection with their parents dwindles as a result. We want to remind you what is essential for our physical and mental health. A considerate togetherness and appreciation. To all people, animals, nature and everything that is available to us here in this wonderful place.
